

B.O.C. Meet at Chestnut Ridge Park. A demonstration event for the Empire State Games. Open to all competitors, no matter what their place of residence. MAP: Color, 1:10,000 scale, 3 meter contours, 1985 edition. COURSES & CATEGORIES: Open Men (6 km), Open Women (5 km), Scholastic Men (5 km), Scholastic Women (4 km). (The controls on the Open courses will be "red" difficulty, on Scholastic courses "orange" difficulty.) To qualify for Scholastic courses, your high school class must not have graduated by August 9. A map-hike will also be available for recreational and non-competitive orienteers. REGISTRATION: Pre-registration for competitive classes. Entries must be received by August 2. Pre-marked maps for all those pre-registered. All others will use master maps. For the map-hike, register at the meet site on the day of the event only. Send entries with entry fee to Pat Quinlan, 1084 Bowen Road, E. North Tonawanda, NY 14120. SCHEDULE: Check-in - 11 am at the Casino in Chestnut Ridge Park. First start - 12 noon. Map-hike: Register and start anytime from 11 am - 1 pm. FEES: For competitive classes, \$3. For map-hike, \$2. Extra maps, \$1 each. (No discounts for B.O.C. members.) AWARDS: Medals for first, second, and third place in each competitive category. The format was "score-0" with a choice of time limits: 60 minutes for the less-in-shape, or 90 minutes for the more-in-shape. All of the Open Men on the longer course were able to find all of the controls within the 90 minute time limit.

A mass start was attempted but not all of the participants were able to cooperate. The organizer, Dave Staszak, was appropriately generous about assigning later start times to late arrivals.

MEET REPORT - MAY 10

B.O.C.'s second meet of the spring was held at the Sardinia Forest. A disappointing turn-out of 16 entries marred an otherwise

flawless event held under flawlessly sunny skies. (Your editor was the Meet Director.)

Three courses were offered in addition to a map-hike. The latter was popular with the two groups of first-timers.

The Yellow course proved a bit too challenging for those who chose it even though all of the points were on or very close to linear features.

John Miklasz had a close but comfortable margin to win on the Orange course. Mark Wolfling was 2:23 behind. After finishing, John treated everyone to a demonstration of "roller blades" which are like "roller skis" in that they are used for dry road ski training but differ in that they simulate the modern skating technique rather than the diagonal stride. In the off-season, John is on the cross-country ski team at the Rochester Institute of Technology. Next year he'll be a sophomore there.

The workers on the finish line, Karen Wood and Sharon Schwab, managed to catch a few rays while waiting for the runners. Even the meet director was able to do a little basking while wondering where everyone was.

Other helpers were Pat Quinlan and Harry Belote. And the Erie County Parks Department was nice enough to open the Sugar Shanty to serve as a meet HQ. Results follow.
