

- ESG SKI-O QUALIFYING RULES Each competitor MUST successfully complete his or her designated course at the qualifiers in 15 min./km or less. basis for the distance measurement will be the course designers shortest skiable route.
- All competitors must complete a minimum of 2 (two) ski-o qualifiers. Scholastic competitors may compete in 1 (one) Ski-O qualifier ONLY if they also successfully complete a regular Cross-Country or Biathlon ESG qualifier AND have participated in some other orienteering event during the previous 12 months. Those Scholastic competitors wishing to take advantage of this rule must petition the Ski-O coordinator in writing of this fact no later than the last scheduled ESG ski-o qualifier. The number of Ski-O qualifiers that must be completed by both divisions will be reduced to 1 (one) DNLY if 75% or more of the scheduled Ski-O qualifying races in a given season are canceled due to weather conditions.
- Competitors for the Finals will be chosen by a system of ratings based on each individuals best two races. Winners of matically will be invited to the Finals as long as rule #2 above is met.
