Terrain: This ridge and valley system with a lot of open woods has more areas of intricate contour detail than is typical of central New York. It has been one of our favorite areas for many years.

Map: The field work in this park was updated in 1996 by Scott Pleban, and the map re-drafted in OCAD at a scale of 1:15,000 and 5 meter contour interval by Mark Dominie. Color photocopies of the old map may be obtained in advance for a price of \$5.

Courses, Classes, and Awards: The full spectrum of courses from white to blue will be offered in the competitive classes on both days. There will also be a string course and separate recreational courses (short, medium, and long) available both days. Awards will be presented to the top three finishers in each of the standard classes. A prize for the top club team will be awarded, based on best finishers from all courses.

Accommodations: The headquarters motel is the Best Western Marshall Manor at I-81 exit 14 in Tully, NY. We have reserved a block of rooms at a special orienteering rate of \$49 per room per day, but make your reservations early! Phone the motel directly at (315)696-6061. If space runs out, the next closest possibilities are the Holiday Inn, Super 8 or Comfort Inn at I-81 exit 11 in Cortland, NY. Camping is available at the Highland Forest Group Camp site, quite near to the first day start location, at a fee of \$5 for the weekend. This is primitive camping (no showers).

Dinner: There will be the traditional CNYO dish-to-pass supper on Saturday night, at Fabius High School on South Street, with a course review to follow. If you can bring some specialty from home to be warmed up at the time (we will have some kitchen facilities) this will be wonderful. Otherwise, visit the deli section at one of the local supermarkets and bring something ready-made! If you plan to attend, mark the appropriate line on the entry blank so that we have available an appropriate supply of plates, cups, utensils, beverages, etc. There will be some space available for group get-togethers immediately before and after dinner--let us know your needs in advance. There will also be showers available at the Fabius School before dinner.

Miscellaneous: We will be producing souvenir headware rather than T-shirts for this event. Put your order on the T-shirt line of the standard entry form. Child care will be available at the event site for \$2/hr, while parents are on the course only. There will be a drawing for a special prize at the Saturday night dinner from a pool of all entrants who correctly explain the origin of the name for this event on their entry form (or who provide an incorrect and entertaining--but decent--alternative suggestion). Meet results will be posted on the Web immediately after the event, but hardcopy can be mailed to you for a fee.
