Once again the snow has melted, the creeks are running, the sun has returned, and it's time to go orienteering.

The season gets underway on Sunday, April 25th at Chestnut Ridge, with a meet organized by Mike Gasiewicz. It will follow the traditional format of Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced courses. To get to the registration area, follow signs from the park entrance.

On Sunday, May 16th the venue shifts east to Camp Schoellkopf on the map that was updated just last year. Phil Wolfling has planned a Score-O event so be sure to be there in plenty of time to register and get ready before the 11:00 mass start. Phil is also planning a point to point beginner's course for the new people that show up.

The final meet this spring is scheduled for Saturday, June 19th at the Sardinia Reforestation area on Genesee Road in southern Erie County. Greg Hyatt is planning a meet in the traditional format of three courses.

Finally, there are a few out-of-town events that you should consider attending. As a part of their. full slate of events, the Rochester club is planning a meet at Letchworth State Park on Sunday, May 23. ROC always puts on a great event so don't miss this one. This year the North American Championships are closer than ever just south of Cleveland. Like all A-Meets in the U.S., there

Annual Meeting Minutes

January 30, 2004

Attendees: Robert Maslanka, David Cady (Editor, Membership), Gary Maslanka, Jon Sundquist, Linc Blaisdell, Jackie Novkov, Lorena Wagar, Tom Wagar, Greg Hyatt, Fred Gordon, Michael Gasiewicz (Treasurer), Phil Wolfling (Secretary), Rebecca Wightman

The meeting started at 7:30 pm at Phil Wolfling's residence.

Treasurer's Report: Mike Gasiewicz presented the report for 1/1/2003 through 12/31/2003 (attached). The year-end balance for the First Niagara money market account was \$7,967.12 (12/29/03), and the balance for the certificate of deposit was \$5,165.93 (12/31/03). Phil Wolfing noted that \$771 was made on Map Hike sales in 2003, with expenses of less than \$100.

Old Business; Insurance Costs: We are chartered through the USOF (United States Orienteering Federation). Fees are \$8 per "member" for insurance plus \$0.50 per "member" for club dues plus a \$20 recharter fee for the Club. Our single membership = 1 "member" and our family membership = 2 "members". We have 27 family and 28 single memberships (82 "members"). The total rechartering fee is \$717. We had a total of 91 entrants in meets in 2003 (a group is counted as one entrant).

Officer Elections: Present officers willing to continue are Michael Gasiewicz, Treasurer; Phil Wolfling, Secretary; and Dave Cady, Newsletter Editor and Membership Coordinator. Phil noted that the Club needed a President. Gary Maslanka volunteered to be President while he is in the area. A unanimous vote reelected the current officers and Gary Maslanka as President.

Newsletter: Dave Cady stressed the importance of meet

directors getting results to him. Publishing dates are March 15, June 15, and August 15, 2004. Dave prints 100 newsletters, with 20 to 30 extras. There was discussion about having the newsletter primarily available via email to save costs. Phil Wolfling noted he doesn't always post the newsletter on the web site until a new newsletter comes out.

ROGAINE: Jon Sundquist said 2000 was the last year our club participated in one (at

Allegany State Park (ASP)). For 2004 we could team with the Rochester Club (ROC), who would do all the administrative work (registrations, food, etc.), leaving the "fun stuff" for our club (hanging and picking up controls). The ROC proposed June or September dates. June would be too soon for us, so mid-September was chosen. There was discussion about where the base camp would be because group tent camping is not allowed in ASP. Camp 10 (undergoing renovations) and Camp Allegany (which has barracks rather than cabins, and is about 1 mile from Camp 10) were both considered adequate.

Meet Dates: These dates are tentative, assuming no conflicts with events planned by the ROC, the Scouts, and the County. Phil Wolfling will check.

November 6, Saturday: Chestnut Ridge Park, Jackie Novkov. Incorporating the Club: We can register as intending to be notfor profit. Requirements include having a Board of Directors. Benefits include having tax exempt certificates. Mike Gasiewicz volunteered to look through the IRS and
State rules. Greg Hyatt volunteered
to assist. The will make a recommendation.

Web Site: Phil reminded meet directors that forms in .pdf format can be accessed by using a hidden link on the Club's web site. Greg Hyatt will assist Phil Wolfling in maintaining the site.

Mapping Plans: The Club has identified eight areas in Erie County to have aerial photography done. They include Akron Falls Park and Zoar Valley and areas in between. Rob Maslanka proposed Carlton Hill (north of Warsaw) for a future map. Dave Cady has requested a quote form TVGA. Jon Sundquist noted there are three additional steps needed:

- 1.Photogrammetry (several places are available to do this)
- 2. Field Checking (will need experienced workers)

Drafting (Jon Sundquist volunteered to do)

The Club needs to update present maps, especially Sardinia. It was agreed that a map of Sprague Brook Park would be a priority, however. A committee of Dave Cady (chair), Jon Sundquist, Jackie Novkov, Rob Maslanka, and Tom Wagar was formed to work on the mapping issues.

Map Hikes: Rob Maslanka will do Sardinia Forest, Rebecca Wightman will do Emery Park, and Phil Wolfling will do Chestnut Ridge Park with a GPS option.

Retail Opportunities: It was proposed to work with the Boy

Scouts in setting up a permanent course for the Scouts at Camp Schoellkopf, using our maps, for a fee. It was also suggested to pursue selling the Map Hikes through their Scout store. Phil Wolfling will investigate.

New Business: Ski-O: Rob Maslanka was interested in running a Ski-O next winter. This will need to be scheduled in early fall.

Map Hike markers: Gary Maslanka suggested new markers be made of corrugated plastic that could be folded to be three-dimensional instead of the flat markers we use now. The Map Hike setters will meet to discuss materials before setting up in the spring.

Old Maps: Phil Wolfling is making archive .pdf files of old Map Hikes.

ASP Map Hike: Rob Maslanka suggested making the Allegany State Park ROGAINE map into a Map Hike. It would need to be field checked to bring it up to the quality of our standard orienteering maps. He and
