County Budget Woes Have Big Impact on Club

The Buffalo Orienteering Club is a victim of Eric County's budget problems. Unfortunately, most of the club's maps are of county parks. The budget problems of the County and the resulting closing of the parks have forced the club to dramatically curtail its schedule this year.

All of the map hikes have been cancelled and only two public events have been scheduled for the Spring.

On May 1, an event will be held at Camp Schoellkopf and on June 12 an event will be held at McCarty Hill south of Ellicottville.


In addition, an effort is being made to encourage local orienteers to attend meets organized by the neighboring Rochester Orienteering Club.

If the parks are opened later in the season an attempt will be made to hold events if meet directors can be recruited and if there is sufficient time to publicize the events.

Major Rogaine To Be Held In 2006

As reported in the minutes of the annual meeting (see page 2), plans are afoot to host a major Rogaine with the Rochester Orienteering Club in Allegany State Park on June 9-11, 2006.

Volunteers from our club will be needed to help with location vetting, control placement and control checking.

During the actual 24 hours of the event it is likely we will also be in charge of the kitchen.

Money Matters

At the annual meeting held in February it was decided to raise the annual dues to \$15 for individuals and \$20 for families. This increase will take effect in 2006.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting

February 4, 2005

Attendees: Jim Acker, Justin Acker, Lincoln Blaisdell, Fred Gordon, Roger Keeney, Jackie Novkov, Charlie Wightman, Tom Wightman, Phil Wolfling (Secretary)

The meeting started at 7:10 pm at Phil Wolfling's residence.

In Rebecca Wightman's absence, Justin Acker volunteered to take notes.

Treasurer's Report: Mike Gasiewicz was absent so we had no treasurer's report. Phil Wolfling noted that we cleared \$1000 through the sale of Map Hikes in 2004. Phil also announced that he is working on a plan to have the Boy Scouts retail our map hikes.

Election of officers:

For president – Phil Wolfling nominated Lincoln Blaisdell; Jim Acker seconded.

For secretary – Roger Keeney nominated Phil Wolfling; Fred Gordon seconded.

For treasurer – Jackie Novkov nominated Mike Gaciewicz; Tom Wightman seconded.

All three candidates were voted into office by a unanimous vote.

Membership:

Phil noted that the club dwindled from 82 members in 2003 to 66 members in 2004.

We discussed various means of addressing this problem:

We need a more active Publicity Committee to advertise club events.

Someone (maybe Linc) will write an article for the Buffalo News to briefly explain orienteering in general, our club in particular, and the 2005 meet schedule

We need to print Phil's 2005 information flyer when available from the web page and post it in public places where likely orienteers will see it.

We discussed the idea of sending an e-mail reminder to members before each event.

We need to put together a welcome letter (packet) for new members and potential new members of the club.

We can use the addresses on the map hike post cards to contact people who may be interested in becoming members.

We need a more active Education Committee to introduce potential members to the sport.

Linc (with Phil's help) will work on finalizing and implementing plans for a permanent sixcontrol beginners' O-course at Chestnut Ridge.

Jackie volunteered to run some evening instruction and practice sessions on weeknights during the summer at Chestnut Ridge Park. Perhaps other volunteers could help with those sessions or could organize other sessions at Ellicott Creek Park.

We could tap into the Boy Scout program through merit badge counselors.

Phil plans to do some orienteering education with the Boy Scouts.

Annual Dues and Meet Fees:

We had a long discussion about dues, after which Phil made a motion, seconded by Roger to increase the annual dues from \$10 to \$15 for individuals and from \$15 to \$20 for families as of March 1, 2005. The motion carried. Phil then made a motion seconded by Roger to lower the meet fee for members from \$5 to \$4 for members and to raise the meet fee from \$7 to \$8 for nonmembers for 2005. The motion carried.

Meet Dates: [Editor's note: Because of subsequent events, the actual meet schedule will differ.]

These dates are tentative. Phil Wolfling checked and there are no conflicts with events planned by the ROC, but we have to check the Scouts and the County. We also need Meet Directors to take the meets where none is listed.

Mapping:

We had a brief discussion about mapping. The Sardinia and Emery base maps urgently require updating. We would like to map at least one new area, and new maps usually have a one-year turnaround. NYS has recent

aerial maps. These could help us as we field check our maps. In essence, the Mapping Committee must meet this year to attend to these urgent needs. Linc will make gathering the map committee together a priority.

Rogaine Update:

The Rochester Orienteering Club is interested in joining with the BflO Club to put on a rogaine in Allegany State Park in June of 2006. They would probably do the logistical work of running the meet, while we would do the course setting, vetting, and helping on the day of the meet. We might also do the
